

Siem Reap- Phnom Penh Tour (04 Nights/05 Days)

03 Nights Siem Reap/01 Night Phnom Penh

DETAILED ITINERARY:

DAY1: ARRIVAL PHNOM PENH - TRANSFER TO SIEM REAP (No Meals)

Sua s'dei and welcome to Phnom Penh! You are welcomed at the airport by your driver who will transfer you to your Shuttle bus Station drive to Siem Reap. Upon arrival Siem reap transfer to your hotel.

Evening we visit Chong Kneas Floating Villages, located 10 kilometers south of Siem Reap. Take a ride in a traditional wooden boat on the Tonle Sap, the "Great Lake" of Cambodia and the largest in Asia. Here we will see plenty of examples of the Khmer way of life on the Tonle Sap. Overnight in Siem Reap.

DAY2: SIEM REAP-ANGKOR WAT (B)

After breakfast, we explore South Gate of Angkor Thom known as Big Angkor, 3km2 walled and moated royal city and was the last capital of the Angkorian Empire, The famous Bayon Temple was an architectural muddle, in part because it was constructed in a somewhat piecemeal fashion for over a century. Terrace of the Elephants is an impressive, two and a half meter tall, 300 meter long terrace wall adorned with carved elephants and gradual that spans the heart of Angkor Thom in front of Baphuon - huge temple mountain in the heart of Angkor Thom, Royal Palace Area and Phimeanakas - impressive rite and sandstone pyramid. Terrace of the Leper King is at the north end of the Terrace of the Elephants, a double terrace wall with deeply carved nag as, demons and other mythological beings. Last visit Ta Prohm temple which is a wonderful combination of human genius and natural beauty! Giant trees have grown here for centuries! This afternoon, we overland to visit the highlights of the Grand Circuit including: Preah Khan - meaning The Sacred Sword, this temple was also built by Jayawarman VII and is famous for its immensely long cruciform corridors and delicate carvings. Neak Pean - This temple is a delicate highlight of Khmer art. Built by Jayavarman VII, this temple is the perfect representation of the heavens on earth. Ta Som was a small classic Bayon style monastic complex consisting of a relatively flat enclosure. East Mebon was built in the 10th Century by Rajendravarman; this temple was situated on a small island in the middle of the Oriental, or Eastern, Baray. Last visit Pre Rup was built in the 10th Century by Rajendravarman.

Overnight in Siem Reap.

DAY3: SIEM REAP - KULEN MOUNTAINS - SIEM REAP (B)

This morning, you will embark on a scenic 75-minute drive along a well-maintained unpaved road to reach Kbal Spean, where an extraordinary experience awaits.

Upon arrival, ascend to the elevated grounds of this remarkable site, adorned with the Thousand Lingas. These ancient carvings unveil a rich cultural heritage, providing a glimpse into the spiritual practices of the past. The atmosphere here is both serene and captivating, creating a connection between the visitor and the historical significance of the site.

After immersing yourself in the wonders of Kbal Spean, commence your journey back to Siem Reap.

Morning transfer Phnom Penh BY Shuttle Bus upon arrival transfer to your hotel.

Later half day city tour of Phnom Penh

In the afternoon, visit the city's prime attractions, you will start your day exploring the famous Royal Palace, built in 1866 under the French protectorate and King Norodom. The adjoining Silver Pagoda, built in 1962, is famous for its lavish decorations, silver paved floor and several Buddha statues made from precious metals & stones. Wander the National Museum, a treasure chest of Angkorian and pre-Angkorian artefacts. After the museum, scale the steps up this small hill to see Wat Phnom Temple, the birthplace of Phnom Penh.

Rest of the day free for independent activities / Enjoy Casino night

Breakfast at hotel transfer without guide to Phnom Penh airport. Embark on your onward flight
